Profession of Faith - The Apostles' Creed

The Westminster Shorter Catechism: #47-48

Q. 47. What is forbidden in the first commandment?

A. The first commandment forbiddeth the denying, or not worshipping and glorifying, the true God as God, and our God; and the giving of that worship and glory to any other, which is due to him alone.

Q. 48. What are we specially taught by these words, "before me," in the first commandment?

A. These words, "before me," in the first commandment teach us, that God, who seeth all things, taketh notice of, and is much displeased with, the sin of having any other God.


The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper


