Till at last, mayhap, hereon, Fused of passion and accord, Love its crown and peace its stay Rise the city of the Lord That we darkly build to-day.





The Westminster Shorter Catechism: #103-105

Q. 103. What do we pray for in the third petition?

Q. 104. What do we pray for in the fourth petition?

Q. 105. What do we pray for in the fifth petition?


